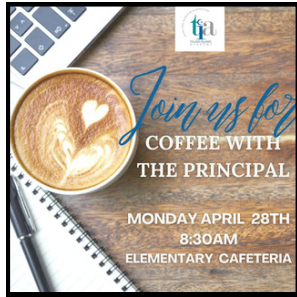

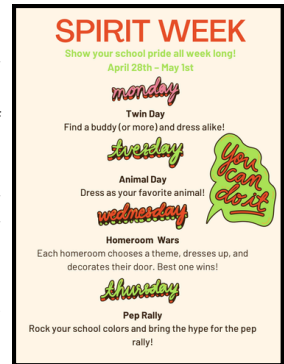
PTO MEETING

1ST GRADERS READ FROM THEIR PUBLISHED BOOK!



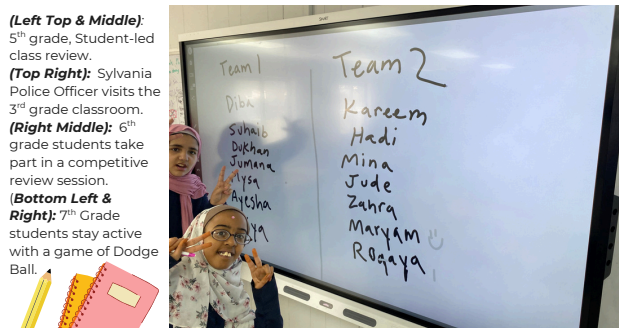
